Experience Morpho Butterfly Magic at Strong National Museum of Play® July 9 through Labor Day

In response to popular demand, the *Dancing Wings Butterfly Garden*® at Strong National Museum of Play will, for a second year, present **Morpho Magic from July 9 through Labor Day**.

Blue Morpho butterflies, with their extraordinary flashing blue iridescent wings, will be released in large concentrations in *Dancing Wings Butterfly Garden* (in addition to the usual variety of colorful, tropical species), creating a visual flight of fancy. Learn all about these stunning blue butterflies and experience the garden's lush, rain-forest environment in a new way.

When resting on a leaf, Blue Morphos are deceptively plain looking, with dull brown outer wings; but, when they unfold their wings and take flight, they reveal a brilliant display of blue iridescence. Come see a profusion of these unique creatures and learn educational tidbits about them with a special handout and butterfly facts sprinkled throughout the garden. Also, watch them emerge from their chrysalises in the garden's emergence chamber.

Did you know . . .

- Blue Morphos aren't really blue at all! Their wings have microscopic structures on their scales that reflect only blue light like a prism.
- There are about 50 species of butterflies commonly called "Blue Morphos," and the *Morpho peliedes* is the most common one in the garden.
- The undersides of a Morpho's wings have brown "eyes," which may serve as a defense mechanism to scare off predators.

- Blue Morphos live about 115 days, but only 15 are as adult butterflies. Most of their lives are spent in the caterpillar (larval) stage and the chrysalis (pupal) stage.
- Once a Blue Morpho caterpillar becomes a butterfly, it can no longer chew. Instead, it drinks using an elongated mouthpart called a proboscis.
- Blue Morphos like to drink the juice of rotting fruit. (Yum!)

Due to limited capacity, entry to *Dancing Wings Butterfly Garden* is by timed ticket only. Entry to the garden requires general museum admission fees plus an additional per person fee of \$3 for nonmembers; \$1.50 for members; Children under 2 free. Call 585-263-2700 to reserve and purchase tickets.
