Abstract: The papers consists of advertisements and promotional materials of

Breyer Animal Creations, a manufacturer of plastic model animals. The materials date from 1975 to 2019, with a bulk of the materials dated 1975 to 1976. The collection is comprised of color photocopies of advertisements used in magazines, catalogs, and other publications,

sketches, correspondence, and photographs.

Administrative history

The Breyer Molding Company was founded in 1950 in Chicago, Illinois by Sam Stone and Charles Schiff. The company was commissioned by F.W. Wentworth to create a model horse for a mantlepiece clock. After completing the commission, the company was inundated with requests for just the horse, and they moved into production becoming Breyer Animal Creation. Breyer specializes in plastic model horses, cast using two or three forms, but also produces other plastic animal forms, model accessories,

structures, and porcelain horses. Breyer Animal Creations was acquired in 1984 by Reeves International and became the Breyer Animal Creation Division of Reeves International.

Reeves International was founded in 1946 as a toy distributor for European toys. From 1946 to 1970 Reeves was one of the top toy distributors in the United States. In 1998 Anthony Fleishmann purchased Reeves International from his father, Walter Fleishmann. Reeves International continues to design and distribute Breyer Horses, CollectA toys, and their own line of Reeves Toys.

Collection Scope and Content Note

This collection consists mostly of color photocopies of advertisements of Breyer horses from catalogs and magazines and other promotional images. The advertisements show the different series offered (traditional, classic, and gift sets), the Marguerite Henry gift set, "The Making of a Horse" flier, and includes an advertisement for Eastman Kodak's Tenite plastic used to make Breyer models. Most of the photocopies have detailed source information handwritten on the reverse side.

The papers also contain four model photographs; No. 20 "Misty of Chincoteague," No. 3000 "The Black Stallion and Alec," No. 2095 "The Black Stallion: Model, softbound book and four-color poster," and an unlabeled model photograph. Of interest are the color photocopy of correspondence from Colonel Toby Brown, Crown Equerry to Queen Elizabeth, and a color photocopy of the original sketch for "Hamilton" by Jennifer Scott.
